THE REPORT OF KOKODA ANGELS AND THE AMBULANCE

1. THE WORK THE AMBULANCE IN THE LAST TWO YEARS.

The new Ambulance donated by Sandvik Mining came to village in Kokoda in November 2010. In 2010 up until last month April 2013 the Ambulance made over 25 major emergency trips and many deliveries of supplies. We have taken sick people from 11 villages in Kokoda areas to Kokoda and Popondetta Hospitals and Saiho and Sangara Health Centres and also to aidposts in the villages. Most of the serious cases were severe malaria attack, deep cuts, severe labour pain and severe bleeding. Out of the 25 trips 2 people from Waju died Ryle, Kei and Elizabeth. Isara all in their late 30s. The most resent one is my last born dad who lives at a block near Kokoda. I couldn't quickly take him to Kokoda hospital because the Ambo had a problem so I left it at Popondetta. Kokoda Angels Health Service has been a bit slow because of Ambulance difficulties and families of sick people carried their sick families on shoulders and wheel barrows to the road these days.

2. THE STATE OF THE AMBULANCE NOW

The Ambulance now is on and off the road because of some difficulties. It is providing services still but not like in the last 2 years. Some of Ambulance parts have been changed because of bad road conditions and many wet crossings. My suggestions and opinions on the Ambulance now is.

1. Do a total repair and give a full service cleanup. 2. To put it on sale, get the money and seek some assistance from some sources and get new one so that Kokoda Angels can continue its most needed Health Services here in Kokoda.

3. WORD OF APPRECIATIONS.

In the last 2 years we have seen many lives been saved by the services

We have worked with Kokoda Angels from the start and have seen many people from different villages with many different kinds of sicknesses .Most of our work was at night times because people would call us on our phones and come to our house anytime at night as early as 4am in the morning.We would sometimes sleep on roadside because of tyre punches and sleepy eyes. Most of the time we would help pregnant women who would have severe bleeding maybe because of miscarriage or abortion in the truck while driving to the hospital in night times.We would be very emotional having tears in our eyes yet a very wonderful experience for us to help and assist the women and even the babies.We enjoy this job so we will continue working with Kokoda Angels.
